



FAST FACTS - Trends in Student Race/Ethnicity



The number of Hispanic students has increased by 604 students and increased 11.5 percentage points of the student body over the last 10 years. Black or African American students have increased by 307 students and increased by 5.7 percentage points of the student body over the last 10 years. White students have decreased by 540 students or 11 percentage points of the student body.



Housatonic Community College is a minority-majority college in the State of Connecticut. In the past ten years the percentage trends of the College have been that white students are declining as Hispanic and Black students as a percentage of enrollment are increasing. Hispanic students have increased such that HCC is now eligible for Title III grant funding.

The percentage of minority students at HCC is equal to 69.8%, white 28.8%, and not reported 1.4%.
