


The chart above shows the <u>final enrollment figures</u> for the Fall 2016 and Fall 2017 semesters. Headcount enrollment decreased 0.1 percent (n = -5) from fall 2016 to fall 2017. The number of credit hours taken decreased 0.5 percent (n = -236), resulting in a full-time equivalent (FTE) decrease of 0.5 percent (n = -16).

Students registered for 12 credits in a semester are said to be attending full time; students registered for fewer credits are said to be attending part time. The fulltime equivalency (FTE) figure is the number of students who would be enrolled if they all took 15 credit hours (for fall 2017, 44,416 total credit hours/15 credit hours per student).




The chart above shows the <u>final enrollment figures</u> for the spring 2016 and spring 2017 semesters. Headcount enrollment decreased 1.4 percent (n = -71) from spring 2016 to spring 2017. The number of credit hours taken increased 0.8 percent (n = 310), resulting in a full-time equivalent (FTE) increase of 0.8 percent (n = 20). Students registered for 12 credits in a semester are said to be attending full time; students registered for fewer credits are said to be attending part time. The full-time equivalency (FTE) figure is the number of students who would be enrolled if they all took 15 credit hours (for spring 2017, 40,924 total credit hours/15 credit hours per student).







The percentage of full time enrollment has decreased by 3.3% in the last 10 years and the number of full-time students has decreased by 149 students. The number of part-time students has increased 206 students at 3.3% of the student body.






The number of full time percentage of students has went down to 30.7%, however the number of full time students has only decreased by n=17 students.









A new student is defined as a first-year student attending any institution for the first time at the undergraduate level




In 10 years, the number of Black or African American students increased by 214 or 14%, White students has decreased by 330 or 22%, and Hispanic students increased by 593 and 38%.






The majority of students who have enrolled fall 2017 are female (n = 3,133, 61.0%), and have decreased in the past 10 years. The percentage of males have increased, from fall 2008 (n=1,844, 36.3%) to 2017 (n=2,005, 39.0%).









Although most of the fall 2016 students are 19 years old, the average for the entire student body is 26.8. An equal number of students are older and younger than age 23.





Although most of the spring 2017 students are 19 years old, the average for the entire student body is 27. An equal number of students are older and younger than age 23.






Of the 5,138 students who registered for the Fall 2017 semester, the majority are continuing students (n = 3,138, 61.1%). This figure may include students who have previously earned an associate's degree or certificate from HCC. Over 21 percent (n = 1,111, 21.6%) reported themselves as new students, first time in any college.

In the table above and in the chart on the next page, a *new* student is defined as a first-year student attending any institution for the first time at the undergraduate level. This definition includes students enrolled for the fall term who attended here for the first time in the prior summer term, as well as students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school - AP, Tech Prep/College Career Pathways, HS Partnership, etc.). Students coded as "new" are self-reported as such and may or may not have previously attended another college.

A continuing student is a student who has attended HCC in the past two years.

A *transfer* student is a student who is coming to HCC from another college.

A *re-admitted* student is a student who is returning to HCC after an absence of at least two years (including summer and winter sessions).

A *high school* student is a student who is taking college courses to earn college credit before graduating from high school.





Most students are freshmen, meaning they have accumulated fewer than 30 grade point average (GPA) credits toward a degree. Students do not earn GPA credits for passing developmental classes (those below course level 100). A large number of students remain categorized as freshmen until they enroll in college-level classes.







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



HCC is offering fewer developmental-level classes as a result of the declining enrollments and preparation for and passage of Connecticut Public Act No. 12-40. From fall 2010 to fall 2017, the count of developmental seats dropped by 2,455, a decrease of 63.0 percent, while the count of collegelevel seats dropped by 948, a decrease of 10.4 percent. New students who do not test at college level in Writing, Reading and Math are offered sixcredit intensive courses at HCC. College level 200 seats decreased by -3.6 percent since Fall 2010.





HCC is offering fewer developmental-level classes as a result of the passage of Connecticut Public Act No. 12-40. From spring 2010 to spring 2017, the count of developmental seats dropped by 2,227, a decrease of 70.3 percent, while the count of college-level seats dropped by 1,225, a decrease of 9.5 percent. New students who do not test at college level in Writing, Reading and Math are offered six-credit intensive courses at HCC.
