


Fall 2017 Freshmen Fast Facts: 1,111 New Freshmen

- Academic Support Center (Lafayette): The ASC offers on ground, online and drop-in tutoring.
- Writing Center (Lafayette): Statistics show that students who take advantage of HCC's Writing Center significantly improve their ability to stay in school and graduate. They get higher grades in their classes when they have support in their writing.
- <u>Computer Labs (Lafayette A230 & 232, Beacon Hall 111 & 114):</u> HCC Students can take advantage of four computer labs which are open and available for student's academic use.
- Guidance Counseling (Lafayette A108): On-campus, professional counseling is available to HCC students for any student issues.
- Library Services (Lafayette Hall): You can check out books, videos, movies, use the computers, access research databases, print, make copies, scan, and use the special resources the professors have on reserve for student use.
- Women's Center (Beacon Hall 371): Support and programming for women at HCC. Men are always welcome.
- Family Economic Security Program: Career Coaching, Financial Advisement, Academic Counseling, and Scholarships available. Contact Alese Mulvhill at 203-332-8517
- The Office of Career Services, Internships and Experiential Learning: The office offers individualized career counseling, résumé and cover letter review, assessment inventories, ePortfolio development, interviewing skills assistance, on-campus career fairs, career workshops and information sessions, as well as internship and job postings.

Honor Societies, HCC Honors Program (see catalog pg. 22)

- **Phi Theta Kappa:** International Honor Society. You need to have 24 credit hours at HCC, cumulative GPA of 3.5+ in a degree program. Contact Earl Graham, in the Student Welcome Center, call to make appointment. Ask to learn how freshmen students can be eligible!
- **Psi Beta:** National Psychology Honor Society. Invitation by the HCC Chapter, accumulated 12 credit hours in a degree program with 3.4 GPA. Contact Dr. Michael Amico, 203-332-5163.
- Alpha Beta Gamma: International Business Honor Society. You must be enrolled in Business degree-seeking curriculum, have 40 credit hours, GPA of 3.2. Contact Professor Thomas Wagner 203-332- 5968 for eligibility.
- Tau Upsilon Alpha: National Human Services Honor Society. Contact Dr. Edward Keene at 203-332-5165 and Laura Turiano at 203-332-5978.
- **Epsilon Pi Tau:** International Technology Honor Society. You must be enrolled in Science, Engineering, or Technology programs, have 30 credit hours, with GPA of 3.0+. Faculty recommendation is required. Contact Professor Rob Ryder at 203-332-5258
- HCC Honors Program: You must have earned 12 cpredit hours and have a cumulative GPA of 3.5+. Faculty recommendations are required. Contact Dr. Kirk Hughes 203-332-5137 for more information on your eligibility for the program.
