# Scholarships

## made possible with your generosity

Your generosity provided access to HCC's quality higher education learning environment for over 300 students through \$375,000 in scholarships and awards.

Each semester, students apply for need-based scholarships, often making a huge difference in the lives of the recipients – sometimes determining whether or not the student can enroll in the College, or complete his or her course work and graduate. Many scholarship recipients graduate HCC and enter rewarding careers in the workforce. Others choose to continue their education at prestigious colleges and universities including Quinnipiac, Sacred Heart University, University of Connecticut, NYU, Boston College and many more.

# **Equity Programs**

## launched with your generosity

### Family Economic Security Program

FESP addresses barriers that marginalized students face to college persistence and completion through intensive and comprehensive wrap-around services and supports. It is a model program that has evolved across three campuses in CT. Over 400 students participated in FESP since 2015; average student retention rate was 30% higher than general population.

Beginning in the Fall 2021, FESP will narrow its focus on supporting low-income, female students with children who are also working one or more jobs. Its "2Gen" approach will encourage 50 students annually and their families to become financially secure and independent, achieve their education goals, and wage sustaining careers.

## **Equity Project**

Launched as a one-year pilot initiative in January 2021, the Equity Project increases access to opportunities and economic mobility by intentionally and strategically supporting under-resourced and under-represented students including first generation college student, undocumented, LGBT+ and students of color. The first cohort of 20 students (10 male/ 10 female) received financial supports targeted at access and retention, combined with campus engagement and learning opportunities to increase their sense of community, belonging and ability to succeed at HCC and beyond.

In 2022, the Equity Project will double the number of students served, building on the pilot's year of learning and achievements, and impacting more students.

# Career Readiness Pipeline Programs

## Advanced Manufacturing Technology Center

HCC's Advanced Manufacturing Technology Center (AMTC) is a pipeline for the state's manufacturing industry, Connecticut's third largest sector. With training designed to respond to specific employer-driven manufacturing needs, the AMTC program prepares students to join CT's manufacturing community of over 4,400 companies.

This past year, 26 students completed the 9-month intensive AMTC program. A new evening cohort was added to the program to meet student enrollment demand. Nearly 100% of students secured employment immediately following program completion. Scholarships, book funds and other financial assistance make this happen for the majority of students.


An additional 30 students participated in College Connections, a dual enrollment opportunity for high school students to earn up to 18 college credits toward a certificate in Advanced Manufacturing.

# STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math

Nearly 2,000 students pursued higher education in one of HCC's 50+ STEAM associate degree or certificate options.

Highlights that supported STEAM learning for students, made possible with your generosity, included the following: the 4th Annual STEAMfest, STEAM Center of Excellence, STEAM student club, Faculty and Staff STEAM Taskforce, Earth Day Celebration, and membership to the Greater Bridgeport STEM EcoSystem. Also, a new agriculture and gardening course work began last year, as well as the establishment of a chapter of the National STEM Honor Society to inspire future student leaders of our increasingly tech-driven world by nurturing STEM education and innovation through project-based learning, leadership development, and community collaboration.

## Food Pantry

In response to the increased food insecurity experienced by students as a result of the pandemic. the College's first on-campus Food Pantry was established this past year, thanks to Stop & Shop. Hundreds of students have received pre-packaged bags of food and are now welcome to walk into the Pantry five days/week to "shop" for food. A mobile food truck provides fresh fruit and vegetables twice/month thanks to Fairfield County's Community Foundation.

## Emergency Fund and Book Assistance

Rapid response to student emergencies help keep students in school. Demands for help have increased; 300+ students over the past year received help paying for rent, unexpected health care bills, groceries, technology related to schoolwork, and more. Book Funds ensure students are prepared on their first day of class.

## Textbook Lending Library

HCC Foundation is easing the burden of textbook costs for low-income students pursuing noncredit certificate programs thanks to an establishing grant from The Scripps Family Fund for Education and the Arts. The Textbook Lending Library was stocked with over 350 books this past year, and is a valuable resource that allows many students to enroll in certificate programs that lead directly to jobs.



## Partnership with Adam J. Lewis Academy



Around the corner from HCC sits a nonprofit elementary school, Adam J. Lewis Academy (AJLA). Scholarships encourage parent enrollment at HCC in vocational education and training programs that lead directly to jobs. # Housatonic Museum of Art

The Housatonic Museum of Art (HMA) is home to one of the premier college art collections in the country. The collection, comprised of over 6,000 original works of art and artifacts, is on display throughout the campus creating a warm and welcoming educational environment that allows students and visitors to enjoy and learn about art.

Despite limited access to the collection on campus over the past year due to the pandemic, we remained committed to ensuring access to our artwork and programming. We reinvented our Peer Docent program by digitizing the curriculum that is now available to all students throughout CT. The HMA commissioned a new work for the permanent art collection by South Korean sculptor, Jongil Ma titled *Be There When You Return*. Our collection continued to grow through gifts to our Native American Art, African Art and Contemporary Art Collections.

The HMA reopened its doors to the public in the Fall 2021 with the BIG ART BASH featuring:

### \$500,000 Landmark Gift from the Werth Family Foundation to establish an Endowment

The Werth Family Foundation is a longtime supporter of the Housatonic Museum of Art, donating nearly \$900,000 since 2004. This past year, the Foundation boosted its support by establishing an endowment to ensure the care and preservation for the museum's collection of over 6,000 pieces of artwork. This gift represents the largest contribution from a single donor in the history of the museum, and underscores the importance of supporting the arts in the greater Bridgeport region.

In honor of this landmark gift, the Werth Family Foundation Atrium was established at the entry to the museum's Burt Chernow galleries, located in Lafayette Hall at Housatonic Community College.




